Bulletin Blurb for Weekend of August 19-20, 2023

In the first reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah this weekend, the Lord is speaking through Isaiah and telling his people how to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. As I was going through this reading, I could not help but see parallels between this passage and the Ten Commandments.

It begins with an exhortation from the Lord to "Observe what is right, do what is just." After instructing the people to do this, the Lord then tells them the reason for doing so: "for my salvation is about to come, my justice, about to be revealed." As the passage continues, the parallels with the Commandments become more and more salient. Through Isaiah's mouth, the Lord says:

"The foreigners who join themselves to the LORD, ministering to him, loving the name of the LORD, and becoming his servants—all who keep the sabbath free from profanation and hold to my covenant, them I will bring to my holy mountain and make joyful in my house of prayer; their burnt offerings and sacrifices will be acceptable on my altar, for my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples."

Here, we find references to the Great Commandment (You shall love the Lord your God, with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, and love your neighbor as yourself), respecting the name of the Lord (Commandment #2), and keeping the sabbath holy (Commandment #3). The Lord goes on to say that these are the ones He will take to Himself and will receive their offerings and sacrifices.

Jesus repeats this several times throughout Scripture, rephrasing it each time, but maintaining the same core message – to love God, love our neighbor, and keep the sabbath holy. I believe the reason He does so is to make sure that we "get" His message in one form or other. He wants nothing more than to have us in Heaven with Him for all eternity. His desire to be united to us in this way was so strong that *He sent Jesus to die* in order to gain our redemption and open the gates of Heaven for our entry. Our directions are laid out so simply and concretely for us that the question then becomes *will we take the first step*?
