Dear Parish Family,

We continue to hear the Bread of Life Discourse. Today, Christ will tell the crowd that He is the living Bread that has come down from Heaven. So, He must prepare them to receive this teaching. First, He instructs them that they need to raise their minds above the physical bread, which only feeds us on earth, to a heavenly bread, which gives eternal life.

Second, Jesus establishes a basic principle found throughout the discourse: people should work to obtain the bread that lasts for eternal life. Third, He introduces God's work, something they would have been familiar with, and connects that to belief in Him. In response to this idea of work, the crowd asks what they must do. Our work is to yield to God's work within us and so believe in His Son and receive Him as the source of our eternal life.

We need adorers in our Perpetual Adoration Chapel. We need someone to fill Saturday at 1 a.m., 2 a.m., and 3 a.m. Eucharistic adoration is a beautiful tradition in our Church that allows us to spend time before our Lord, who loves us. Keep in mind the question He asked Peter, James, and John in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Could you not keep watch with me for one hour?" There is no greater gift that we can give God than the gift of our own time.

Monday, August 5th and 6th we will have our teacher in-service at St. Francis School. Please pray for our teachers and staff as they take these two days to regroup, pray, and grow together before school begins! On August 7th, we have our first day of school! I am shocked that summer has already gone so fast and cannot wait for what this new school year will bring. We will have our normally scheduled 8 a.m. mass, which will be a Votive Mass of the Holy Spirit, a traditional mass offered at the beginning of school.

This mass asks for the Holy Spirit's guidance and wisdom. Please feel free to attend this beautiful mass! We also pray for all our teachers and students as the school year begins. May all our hearts and minds be open and receptive to what we are taught, and may God continue to bless us.

When I first arrived, the back rooms in the office and hall were one of my top priorities. Many of you may not even know that there are rooms back there, most of them are used for storage. Over the months, we have been cleaning them out, but one has some serious water damage that leaks into the room. Recently, there has been a strong smell in the office and hall. 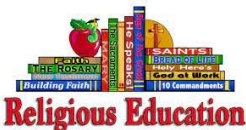
