Over the past few days, I've been thinking quite a bit about what the season of Advent really is – preparing for and waiting for the birth of Jesus alongside the Blessed Mother. Although I cannot speak from personal experience, I imagine that the last month of a woman's pregnancy can be both exciting and terrifying, exhilarating and exhausting all at the same time. There are all the things that need to be accomplished – the house prepared, the room readied, the clothes and diapers gotten. These feelings of anticipation, though, are tempered with exhaustion and a bit of fear as the woman experiences great changes in her body making sleep difficult and waking hours uncomfortable. And the thought of bringing a new life into the world is absolutely terrifying – at least to some extent.

I cannot imagine that the Blessed Mother was exempt from these feelings. I would argue that she may have experienced them to a greater extent than we do. Mary was very young – about fourteen or so – at the time of the Annunciation, making her about fifteen at the time Christ was born. She likely had the same concerns about making all the best preparations and having everything just so for her coming baby boy. I also imagine that she had some of the same fears about bringing a child into the world – although her child was also God – so she likely had a few more anxieties than we would.

But more than getting wrapped up in all of the worries and the circumstances, I imagine Mary sitting quietly and cradling her very pregnant belly – praying, contemplating, and singing lullabies to her Son as she waited to cradle Him in her arms. In the midst of the questions that arose all around her, I imagine that she still experienced the peace that surpasses all understanding because, contrary to what a popular Christmas carol supposes, she *did know* who she carried in her womb.

Throughout this week and the remainder of Advent, may we ask her to allow us to sit next to her as she prays, contemplates, and sings. And may we join her in doing so as we, too, await the birth of her Son, our Savior.
