Dear Parish Family,

Duc in Altum! These Latin words are what Christ tells Simon this weekend to “Put out into deep waters...” Christ tells us the same words today, “go deeper into your spiritual life!” Better yet, Christ tells us take a risk and plunge into a personal relationship with Him. This phrase was a favorite expression of Pope St. John Paul the Great. He used it often, especially in his Apostolic Letter at the beginning of the new millennium.

In this Letter, he outlines the priorities of the Church. He writes, “*Duc in altum!* Let us put out into the deep! These words ring out for us today, and they invite us to remember the past with gratitude, to live the present with enthusiasm and to look forward to the future with confidence: because Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.”

Lent is Coming – Are You Ready?

As I mentioned last weekend, Lent is a month away. Ash Wednesday is on March 5th. Please keep in mind that we are obligated to abstain from meat if we are 14 years old and onward. Those who are 18 to 59 are obligated to fast. Fasting means a person is permitted to eat one full meal; two smaller meals may also be taken. You know your own needs and what is a healthy and regulated amount of food.

Those who are sick or women who are pregnant or breastfeeding do not have to fast or abstain on Ash Wednesday or throughout Lent. They are encouraged to find some other suitable practice like increased prayer and almsgiving. We will have mass at 7 a.m. at St. Joseph, Noon at St. Joseph, and 6 p.m. at St. Michael on Ash Wednesday. Please keep in mind it is **not** a Holy Day of Obligation, but we are obligated to fast and abstain. If we don't do these two penances, then receiving ashes is pointless. Why wash the outside of the cup if the inside is dirty?
