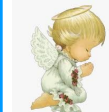

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend's Gospel takes place at the highpoint of St. Mark's Gospel, while Jesus and His Apostles are relaxing on the Mount of Olives, which overlooks the city of Jerusalem. After a busy day of teaching and challenging the scribes and Pharisees in the Temple, Jesus knows that the end of His earthly mission is drawing near. His Passion and crucifixion will take place in just a few days.

This sentiment is echoed in our liturgy, since we are close to concluding another liturgical year. Next weekend is Christ the King, and then we have the Season of Advent. Christ the King marks the end of our Liturgical Year while the Season of Advent marks the beginning of the New Liturgical Year, like how the New Year marks the beginning of our secular calendar. I would strongly encourage we use this time to recommit ourselves to the faith and spiritual practices, especially Mass and Confession.

Jesus takes advantage of a comment by His disciples about the beauty of the Temple to point out to them the passing nature of all worldly glories. You can read Mark 13:1-23 for this context. We can picture Christ explaining these coming events, seeing them unfold in His mind's eye, as the disciples stare at Him, hardly daring to believe what He says.

He speaks of these future events with a sureness and clarity that we have come to expect, but which must have been alarming for the first time. The Lord is speaking about the end of history, the end of the world. Jesus wants us to know what the future holds so that we can live wisely in the present.

Looking ahead, please keep in mind that December 9th will be a Holy Day of Obligation. We will have a mass at 7am at St. Joseph and a Mass at 6pm at St. Michael. Typically, this Holy Day is on December 8th, but it is transferred to the Monday and once again *it is* a Holy Day of Obligation. So, please mark your calendars and help spread the word that this is a Holy Day!

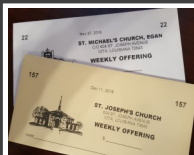
