Dear Parish Family,

The month of November is dedicated to the Souls in Purgatory. We had a successful celebration of All Saint's Day. We also had a beautiful mass in the mausoleum on All Soul's Day. Despite the chilling 34 degrees, we had about 45 people. I thank Joe Cart for setting everything up, and the wonderful parish staff for helping with the candles. Without them, these masses and events wouldn't become a reality!

Just as we have the normal calendar year, the Church has her own liturgical year. Advent marks the beginning of the new liturgical year. So, November is the perfect time to reflect on where we have spiritual grown. It is also the time to reflect on what's known as the Four Last Things: death, judgment, heaven, and hell. During the next few weeks, I hope to look at these topics through faith and the teaching of the Church.

My hope to offer a short reflection on the first topic: death. The Church reminds us that, "Death is the end of our earthly pilgrimage, during which God offered us His grace and mercy..." In a way, our understanding of death is inseparable from our understanding of life. We were created for holiness and eternal life with God. Because of the Fall, our nature was wounded, and we experience sin and death.

On one hand, in purely natural terms, death is a frightening mystery. On the other hand, we who have faith can approach death with a certain peace. We have this hope in eternal life and don't have to fear death because Christ has already conquered death by dying on the Cross. And by rising from the dead, He has opened the gates of Heaven for us. So, we know that death is not the end. It can't be. This doesn't mean we can't miss our loved ones who have died. We can certainly have a heavy heart, and may always have one, but we can still hold onto that hope of seeing them in Heaven. So, we work now to get there!
