As the Lord has been moving in my own life recently and prompting me to rearrange my life so that He maintains His proper place in it, I have been making a deliberate attempt to spend more time in focused prayer. In doing so, the Lord is showing me that we often miss an indispensable part of the act of praying – listening for His response.

How many times have we gone before the Lord in prayer with a list of things that we rattle off – everything from problems at work, to problems at home, to problems in the world, the list goes on and on. We come with burdens, hurt, pain, and sometimes, incredibly deep wounds that need the care of the Divine Surgeon. We express all of these to the Lord then we take a deep breath...and end our prayer.

Ending our prayer before the Lord has a chance to respond to us and all that we have just laid before Him is like going to the doctor when you are sick but walking out of the appointment just as he is about to give you a diagnosis and a treatment plan. Maybe this happens because we are tired, and we can't carry these burdens anymore.

But could it be because we are afraid of what the Lord's response to us will be? Could it be that leaving before He has a chance to respond frees us from any other responsibility other than giving it to Him? In my own prayer over the last few weeks, the Lord has been challenging me to remain with Him once I have shared my heart. He has shown me how loving and gentle He can be in responding to the most pressing issues and the most seemingly insignificant ones that I bring to Him. With the Lord, nothing goes unnoticed. I am finding that when I am still in His presence and allow Him the time and space to speak, I am consoled, freed, unburdened and I come away feeling loved and peaceful, even if all my problems are still present. This week, I want to encourage all of us to deliberately go before the Lord in prayer. Lay your concerns and cares down before Him then allow Him to speak to your heart. Above all, prayer is a *conversation* between the Creator and the creature.
