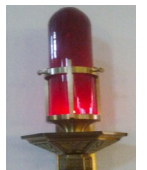

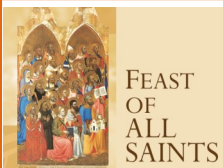

FEAST OF ALL SAINTS

All Saints Day is Sunday, November 1st. All weekend Masses will be celebrated for the Feast of All Saints. We will have the Blessing of the Cemetery– The blessing will be held **Sunday, November 1st.** Sensat Cemetery, Egan will be after the 9AM Mass; St. Joseph Cemetery will be after the 11 AM Mass, the Iota Cemetery (Town), at 3PM.



All Souls Day Mass - will be Monday, November 2nd at 8AM in the Mausoleum.
