Dear Parish Family,

As I mentioned last weekend, the month of September is dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows. This memorial points us to Mary at the foot of the Cross. The celebration follows directly after the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross and invites us to enter Mary's compassion, as she faithfully shares the sufferings of her Son.

The Chaplet of the Seven Sorrows is a rosary-based prayer that reflects on the Seven Dolours (or Sorrows) of Mary. There are chaplets at the doors of the church and in the office if anyone who wishes to learn more, pray, and reflect on the seven sorrows of our Lady. It is a beautiful devotion that I pray daily. It can lead us to reflect on Christ's Passion and suffering through the eyes of His, and our. Mother.

This Sunday, the Church will beatify an entire family. Józef and Wiktoria Ulma lived on a farm in southeastern Poland with their six children, Stanisława, aged 7, Barbara, 6, Władysław, 5, Franciszek, 4, Antoni, 2, and Maria, 1. The family welcomed and hid eight Jewish people fleeing from the Nazis. They did this despite the Nazis declaring that anyone caught hiding Jews would be killed.

In the early hours of March 24, 1944, Nazi police invaded the home, forced all the occupants to line up, and were shot. No one survived. The house was burned, and the bodies were quickly buried. Later, they were dug up and given a proper burial. The diggers noticed that beside the body of Wiktoria, lay an unborn child. She was seven months pregnant. It is believed that Wiktoria gave birth at the time of her execution.

What a powerful witness to the respect of all human life, and the importance of a strong Catholic family. We are reminded that even during suffering, God still reigns supreme. This family, though they suffered immensely, gained the martyrs palm. May we strive to be like the Ulma family in all that we do, leading one another closer and closer to Christ!

Bulletin Blurb for Weekend of September 9-10, 2023


This coming Friday, September 15, is the memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows and the fifth anniversary of my consecration to a life of virginity lived in the world. My devotion and love for Our Lady of Sorrows was planted by Fr. Champagne and the Community of Jesus Crucified in St. Martinville, as Fr. Champagne was my formation director and the Community lovingly welcomed me with open arms and fervent prayers. Prior to being introduced to the Community, I do not recall thinking much about Mary under this title. In fact, I would have probably avoided dwelling on it.

However, as time passed and I spent more time immersed in formation surrounded by this beautiful Community, their charism, which is living the dying dispositions of Jesus, naturally introduced me to Our Lady of Sorrows. Under this title, Mary found me and took me as one of her own. I learned what it is to suffer joyfully for the sake of the Lord and the Church, and the impossibility of avoiding suffering in this life. Little by little, Mary taught me how to stand at the foot of the cross with Jesus on Calvery, not wavering, falling, or having to be held, but standing, as she did, under her own power. She ministered to Jesus by her sheer presence there at the foot of the cross. She did not attempt to remove His suffering from Him, but rather, she accompanied Him in His suffering.

I had a friend who once told me that it was no coincidence that I was consecrated on this day and, as time passes, I have found this to be more and more true. As I think back on the last five years and how I have changed and grown, one of the most powerful things I have learned is not to be afraid of suffering - even to embrace it - as Our Lady of Sorrows did. In doing so, we are united to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. May we never be afraid to stand with Mary at the foot of the cross.
